#WorldBookDay



For World Book Day this year we are very fortunate to have secured tickets to go and watch Pinocchio at the Courtyard in Hereford on Thursday 2nd March.

Alongside the performance, the Courtyard Education Team will then be visiting us at school on Thursday 9^{th} March to carry out a drama-based workshop for each class throughout the day focusing on the classic tale of Pinocchio.

We will also be holding a 'Book Sale' after school on Thursday 2nd March (more details to follow).

We will have a **non-uniform day** in celebration of **World Book Day** on **Friday 3rd March** where children (and staff) are invited to dress up as a favourite book character. We feel this will encourage the children to have great fun, but more importantly it will inspire them to read more books! World Book Day is the biggest celebration of books and reading in UK and encourages children to explore the pleasures of books and reading.

All children will receive a free £1 World Book Day Book Token, which can be exchanged at local bookshops (Rossiter Books, WHSmith, Waterstones, Sainsburys and Tesco) for one of the 15 specially produced titles or used as part payment against the purchase of another full-priced book.

Half-Term Challenge



The Herefordshire Council is running an art competition to provide children and young people with an opportunity to express what they like best about living in Herefordshire through art.

The theme of the competition is 'My Herefordshire' and children are invited to create a picture that represents what Hereford means to them. It could be a place, an activity, a club or even a person.

The competition is open to all children who attend a schools or settings across the county from early years up to secondary.

There will be first, second and third place prizes from each of the five age groups below (15 winners in total) and the budding young artists behind the winning entries will receive a £30, £20 and £10 book token respectively, and a print of their own artwork to keep.

- Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) ages 3-5 (Nursery and Reception) and Key Stage 1 – ages 5-7 (Years 1-2)
- Key Stage 2 ages 7-11 (Years 3-6)
- Key Stage 3 ages 11-14 (Years 7-9)
- Key Stage 4 ages 14-16 (Years 10-11)
- Key Stage 5 ages 16-18) Years 12 and 13)

Each piece of art should be drawn or painted on an A4 size piece of white paper, portrait or landscape.

To enter simply return you child's artwork to school on Monday 27th February. Please paperclip a separate note to the artwork which includes the child name along with a brief description of the Herefordshire place, activity, club or person in the drawing / painting and why it means a lot to them

The deadline for entries is the morning of Monday 27th February.

Each of the winning entries will be printed and put on public display in council buildings across Herefordshire.
